“Betws Y Coed Village ” 2.0 Hour Scooter Event

1.45hrs scootering 15 minutes registration and inspection

This route is great for a first timer on a scooter, and the perfect quick way round to see what the conwy valley has to offer. Our more fit team use this route as their training circuit, a flat undulating path scootering from one train stop to another - from Llanrwst to Betws Y Coed.

At a low 7mph you will be at our neighbouring village under an hour. Scenic views and a few great establishments along the way, and not just for food and drink.

Directions

Come out of Watling Street car park and turn left and follow the road round and come to the junction for the A470.


IMPORTANT

You must NEVER use (ride) our scooters on the public highway, and your rental agreement requires you to know this. At times where there is no pavement you must dismount and walk with your scooter!

Turn left along the pavement of the A470 until you reach the traffic lights with a pedestrian crossing. Cross over, and continue heading south along the pavement. After passing the houses it opens up to view the Gwydir Forest across the valley, where you can see one of our other tracks routes down through the forest.



View point down onto your Betws Path




View of Uphill Left Track Route

You are on this path all the way to the Waterloo Bridge. Your next point of interest is passing the Meadowvale (Texaco) Garage to stock up on any cold water or energy bars. A few hundred yards further along you can see a beautiful building on your left nestled in the trees. This is the Ffin y Parc Gallery which is well worth a visit later on for its numerous art collections and a great tea room and grounds.

Half a mile along you can be entertained watching the folks scream on the Plumet and Tree Nets from the road at the Zip World Fforest. The next point of interest just before the turning right over the Waterloo bridge, is the waterfall on the left from the Afon Euarth. After heavy rain this is quite impressive.

Whilst on the bridge grab a moment to see the flow of the conwy river, and try and spot the many wading birds. KingFishers, Dippers & Herons



On your left you will pass the Shell Garage, and the Waterloo Hotel, and start to see the residential properties of Betws y Coed.

On the second right turn, sign posted to the Train Station you will see a large playing field and an abundant of trendy shops and eateries. At the end of the row of shops, cross over to the end of the car park, where there is a path to access to playing fields. If you wish to continue scootering this is also a route to the idilic Pont-y-Pair Bridge which goes over the Afon Llugwy river.

IMPORTANT

It is the law, PEDESTRIANS ALWAYS have right of way on public footpaths ! Be curtious and always stop scootering to pass pedestrians on a typical pavement, as you do not want to bump into them.

Betws Y Coed is one of the bigeest destination attractions in North Wales, and is often manic with visitors. We highly advise that you walk once on the main road pavement to go to the Pont-y-Pair Bridge. Once there cross over to a small public space to view the river and waterfall. There is also a public toilet here.

It is likely now time to start your return journey and retrace your tracks back.
